International and Jurisdictional Issues Post-Brexit

The webinar will address some principal issues regarding choice of law, jurisdiction and enforcement of judgments in the future EU-UK relations. What implications and practical impacts will ensue following the UK's withdrawal from the EU?

Hugh Mercer QC is a highly regarded barrister and Avocat (Belgium) practising in a broad range of areas with a particular emphasis on public law, private international law, EU law and human rights. He is also the Chair of the Future Relationship Working Group of the Bar of England and Wales and the UK Delegation to the Council of Bars and Law Societies of Europe (CCBE). He is also a former Leader of the European Circuit, which brings together advocates engaged in cross-border work. Moreover, he sits as a Deputy High Court Judge and is a Bencher of Middle Temple.

Erik Lagerlöf is a lawyer at the law firm Vinge, as well as an adjunct professor of law at Stockholm School of Economics and a Visiting Fellow at St Edmund's College, Cambridge. He has previously worked as a legal secretary (référendaire) for the Swedish and subsequently the British judge at the CJEU and as an academic at the University of Cambridge, EUI and Harvard Law School.

Ulf Maunsbach is an associate professor in private law and head of Law Department at the Faculty of Law, Lund University. In his research, he focuses on private international law in a contemporary European context.

Boel Flodgren, professor in business law and previously *rectrix magnifica* at Lund University, will act as moderator.
